

MORALITY AND LEADERSHIP TRAINING

All pupils are required to do a compulsory course in moral issues and cultural aspects of Zambia. In this course pupils learn what is regarded as acceptable conduct in their daily life both in and outside school; they learn about respect for elders, respect for other people and responsibility and roles in different settings including home, work, school, church and among peers.

CLASSROOMS/CLASS SIZE

There are three blocks, each with four large ultra-modern classrooms. The blocks are connected by a concrete walkway in order to make movement from one block to another easy during the rain season. In order to provide maximum contact and help from teachers, the class size is restricted to 30 pupils at all levels.



STAFFING

The school boasts of a very experienced and qualified crop of teachers from renowned schools around the country. Our teachers are not just well qualified and experienced but also self-motivated men and women. You can be rest assured that your child will receive both academic and moral development at Chalo Trust School because we give holistic education. BOARDING FACILITIES

The school has state-of-the-art hostel facilities with splash-back ceramic tiles in every dormitory and we provide high quality accommodation to our students which is unrivaled in Zambia. The floor is decorated with a layer of clay and ceramic tiles, which give a sense of comfort, hygiene and homeliness. All the windows are steel-framed and burglar proofed. It is indeed a "Home away from home," as the saying goes.

Each hostel has a resident house parent who provides pastoral care, guidance and counselling, and basic medical care. The school does laundry for the pupils but only for their school uniforms and linen. Pupils are encouraged to do part of their own laundry, in order to encourage them to take responsibility. This indeed is the essence of boarding life, that our children must learn to do what they do not do at home where maids and servants do everything for them.

CHRISTIAN ETHOS

As a Christian school, CTS has a strong Christian culture and we acknowledge God as the creator and recognize the reality of sin and the need for redemption through the Lord Jesus Christ as necessary to salvation. In the light of this, we teach values, attitudes and skills that are God-honoring. We conduct an inter-denominational Chapel every Sunday at which our own teachers and invited preachers speak. (*Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it. Proverbs 22:6*)

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Chalo Trust School provides a wide range of sporting as well as non-sporting activities. We have sporting activities such as football, netball, volleyball, basketball, and clubs such as JETS club, Environmental Education and Community Services club, Performing Arts Club and Communication Forum Club. We also have entertainment for our students every Saturday evening and we encourage the development and display of a student's gifts and talents be it musical or athletic gifts. We are a member of the Independent Schools Association of Zambia (ISAZ) and this membership allows us to expose our pupils to other schools through various Inter-School competitions and activities.

SECURITY

There is a 24-hour security team employed by CTS to ensure the safety of students.

PHYSICAL LOCATION

Chalo Trust School is a Secondary and Primary Christian, Boarding, Co-education school, that is located in Lusaka's Chamba Valley, behind Hybrid Poultry Farm. It is off Great East Road, about fifteen minutes drive both from town and the airport. (Turn left at PHI roundabout from town and right from airport). It is situated in a natural and serene environment suitable for serious and un-interrupted study, conferences, seminars and camps.

OUR ACADEMIC PHILOSOPHY

Our mission is to "Create an environment of order, truth, care and concern where students of diverse economic, cultural and spiritual backgrounds live together and prepare for tertiary education by beginning the habit of life long learning, personal and spiritual development".

At Chalo Trust School, we believe that education should inspire a love for learning and prepare individuals to make a positive contribution to the local environment and the world at large.

THE CURRICULUM

The secondary school offers a broad general curriculum. In grade 8 and 9 (Juniors), where the aim is to introduce children to a wide range of subjects. Each pupil is expected to take a total of 9 or 10 subjects of which 8 are core and compulsory; 1 is elective and, 1 compulsory and non-examinable. At this level, we offer the Zambian syllabus. This is to enable those that might elect to leave Chalo after grade 9 to go into the Government schools or other private schools, where the requirement for anyone to sit the grade 12 examination is a grade 9 certificate.

From Grade 10 to Grade 12 (Seniors), pupils focus on the General Certificate of Education (GCE) curriculum. This is a program provided by Cambridge University from the United Kingdom. This program allows students to go to any university in the world and gives them a competitive advantage when it comes to getting accepted to many foreign universities. At this level, pupils are required to take a minimum of 8 examinable and 2 non-examinable subjects as outlined below.
